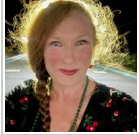

“ This year has been a shockingly challenging one on so many levels. My boy and I have had such incredibly low times, the pain has been tangible. I have felt lost, alone and drowning in despair. Then, I met Dr Alice. She came to us through Westmead Children’s Hospital as she worked within the psychiatric hub, specifically dealing with children on the autism spectrum and other intellectual disabilities, and their parents. Like an angel, she metaphorically scooped both my son and I up in her arms and she actually helped. We had face-to-face meetings in the hospital, and then lockdown happened and our meetings went online. Week after week, she contacted me via zoom, to check how we were going, and primarily to help me understand myself and my own history, and then empower me with tools to really hear my boy, and to learn about his needs. Our sessions were meant to go for 2 hours a week for 8 weeks, as we were doing the Circle of Security course together, but I talked so much, that she gave me all the time I needed. By the time I completed the course, this kind and gentle child psychiatrist had given me over 12 weeks of one on one assistance. Not only did she do that, but she contacted the NDIS for us, and helped get a new plan implemented for my son. Nothing seemed too hard for Dr Alice. I can only imagine how busy she was working at Westmead Children’s Hospital within the psychiatric disability area, and yet when she gave her time to me, there was never a moment where I felt like I was an imposition. She was always so calm and at ease. She was so young yet so wise. I respected her deeply, and was immensely grateful for her input into our lives that when our sessions ended in September, I sat down to write a thank you card to her. As I was writing, I realised it was way more than a thank you cards worth of words. I had so much to say about how she had gone beyond the call of duty to really ensure that we were okay, that it became a letter of pages. Weeks passed and I still hadn’t sent the letter because I hadn’t finished it, and then on 26 October, I actually sent it. I ticked that

very important thing off my list. I waited for her reply, but there was nothing. I knew she had been awarded a promotion within the hospital so I thought maybe her email address had changed. It seemed strange that she hadn't responded though because she was one of the most efficient people I had ever come across and was always so prompt with her replies. But I continued waiting because she was busy. And then, last week, I forwarded the letter to her colleague and supervisor, Dr Dossetor, to check if her email address was different because I really wanted her to read my words to her. It had taken me so long to compose this letter because I had spoken from my heart about the massive difference she had made in our life and the depth of gratitude in my soul to her. Because of this, I only found out about her tragic death yesterday. I am heartbroken. Heartbroken for the amazing life that she lived and what was to come. Heartbroken for all the children her care and kindness touched. Heartbroken for her profession, for she was truly gifted and had so much more to offer. And oh so heartbroken for her family whol send my deepest condolences to. Here's to you, Alice Wong. Your kindness towards us will never be forgotten. I only wish I'd got that letter to you sooner. Know that you have made a difference in our lives.

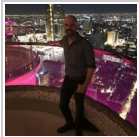
