We got to know each other as colleagues and although she would bring me system problems/questions I would always have questions for her regarding finance and accounting. She taught me a lot and always took the time to explain things - she had a great deal of patience for me.

I will remember her as always having a smile on her face and along with that was a great deal of wit, wisdom, spirit, pragmatism, kindness and a sense of humour.

Although my father was from Hong Kong the things I know from him are always a bit vague as he did not really know the culture aspect and it was nice that she was always keen to enlighten and educate me on such things, especially where it came to food and traditions. To me she had a great sense of style and taste. From her sleek bob down to her (very hard to buy for smaller-size-than-me) shoes, she always carried herself with an air of assuredness and was always impeccably turned out usually in bright colours and bold patterns. She always had an eye and appreciation of aesthetics and beauty. She always liked to show me photos of lovely and beautiful things she had seen or sought out, like Jacaranda trees in full bloom. What gave her a great deal of delight was seeking out food and delicacies that were presented or styled in an unusual or striking way. Although she appreciated incredible and lovely looking cakes and desserts she was never keen on how much sugar might be in them, I do recall cakes she experimented with in a bid to perfect them where she would inform me she had halved the sugar to better suit her tastes (and mine) and hoped it still worked. She would however, always reserve the most effusive praise for the creations that Matthew put together, usually a blend of appealing to the minds eye as well as having hidden nutritional benefits as well.

Indeed anyone who knew Christine would know her as a proud and devoted mother to Matthew. Anytime she spoke about him her demeanor would change and she would light up, I do not think there is anything in the world that she would most prefer to think and talk

about other than Matthew really. She would speak about him often and share what he may be studying and learning and putting into practice, his achievements and what he was doing in his work. But it was to his character that she most wanted you to get a sense of, that he was a caring, kind and upstanding young man who thought of others was always something she was the most appreciative of. You definitely got a sense of the close relationship they shared and my thoughts are with Matthew, as he has lost a loving mother and a close confidante.

It is definitely family that was closest to Christine's heart. Through work I know Kerrie very well and came to know Annie too. As the eldest in my family of sisters I saw a great deal of that fierce protectiveness, love and care in Christine that I identified and related very much with. My heart goes out to Kerrie and Annie as the close sisterly bond they shared was definitely a special one and it will be so strange to them to no longer have their big sister around that they have grown up with and known their whole lives.

It has taken me a while to put the above together because I keep breaking down in tears. I will miss her dearly. It is sad to think I will never hear from or get advice from her again. The good thing is that earthly suffering cannot affect her now, she is free of that and I will reflect and cherish the lovely time it has been to have known one another. Dearest Christine, may you rest in peace.
