In our eyes, Tim was a clever and hard working fellow who would not easily give way. He told us he ran a BBQ business in Hong Kong before migration. Although he had never been properly trained, he had become a well known BBQ chef through observing others, learning from experiences and repeated improvements.

Tim was a person who always took challenge positively. The couple started a new business after migration. With his creativity in food cooking and good service, his customers kept coming back. Tim was generous and loved sharing. After retirement, the couple frequently invited friends to their home to enjoy their beautiful meals. Each family just needed to bring a dish and we could enjoyed the fascinating foods of the Cheung Family. Tim was a capable chef. His roasted pork, sea foods, and other traditional foods were mouth-watering. In addition, Tim was observant with a good memory. He could spot who liked what in the meal and would give you a box of your favourite food at the end of the gathering. Tim had a sense of humour and his reaction was quick. He could create a joyful atmosphere for his friends. In short, with Tim in a gathering, there was no boredom.

Tim was a caring person. He always considered other's needs and liked helping others. I left my handbag in a Food Court on one occasion. Since then Tim always reminded me in a tactful way of my bag at the end of our gathering. When he found me in a hurry, he would suggest giving me a lift. 2 nights before he passed away when I visited the family, he still asked if I needed a lift to go home.

Tim was positive and optimistic. He pursued more time in his life and was always full of hope. He faced each stage bravely during his 4-year battle with the disease. He continued to seek hope when

situations became disappointing. He was tough.

Tim loved his family very much. He insisted to share housing responsibilities when he felt better. I could see he had a strong urge to protect his family. He was asseetive in decision making. If something needed to be done, he would do it immediately. I guess he might want to reduce his family 's duty to look after the yards in the future . He had redesigned his front and back yards within a short time , just leaving a small piece of manageable land for Bonnie to plant her vegetables.

Today, while the Cheung Family has lost a loving husband, a loving father and a loving father-in-law, we have also lost a wonderful friend. Yet it is comforting to know that Tim is now without pain and illness. He is resting in peace with the Lord. He is now in Heaven with our Heavenly Father. In addition, as Christians, we can meet him one day in the Heaven.
