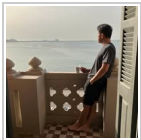

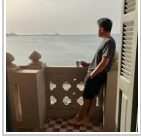

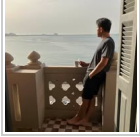

“ Peter Worsley - Dad's University of Sydney classmate

I first got to know Tim in 1959 when I began my studies in the Faculty of Arts. It was through a close school friend, Michael Curtin, that I first met your dad. Michael had joined the University of Sydney Hockey Club and there met a number of Malaysian and Singaporean students from various faculties, including Tim. Michael, Tim and I were in the same year of the courses in Modern History. This meant we often worked in Fisher Library together, ate lunch and sometimes dinner together in the student union at the University and sometimes in China town. In those days there were evening lectures and the university was a very lively place until well into the evening. Sometimes we ended up at the hostel in Drummoyne where Tim and a number of Malaysian and Singaporean students lived and Tim would cook us something to eat there.

In the long vacation around Christmas we would usually find work to earn some extra money to help with our fees and books. I worked on the railway yards in Darling Harbour a couple of times and the Post Office on nightshift sorting the Christmas mail. I remember on one or two occasions Tim became a bus conductor, working the buses which passed along Parramatta Road. I remember him complaining about having to carry his conductor's bag heavy with coins—halfpennies, pennies, threepences and sixpences, shillings and two-shilling coins. At the end of a long shift they could weigh quite a lot. One evening, Tim told us much to our amusement, that he was so annoyed that he took all the copper coins, halfpennies and pennies in his bag and cast them all from the back platform of the bus into the following peak hour traffic. He was quite happy, he said, to pay for what he did from his weekly salary just to be rid of them.

Occasionally, we went fishing. Tim was a keen fisherman. Sometimes at lunchtime, I remember, four or five of us would end up at the wharf in Rose Bay where we hired a rowing boat and

spent a couple of hours retrieving bream from the Bay before returning to afternoon lectures. On a couple of times during the Christmas break we drove down to the Snowy Mountains to fish for trout. We camped on the Snowy River a little upstream from Jindabyne for a week or ten days, travelling about looking for rivers and lakes where the trout were supposed to be plentiful. Often I found myself fishing alongside Tim waiting for quite long periods for a fish to take my lure while Tim caught numbers of fish.

I remember well the day Tim left for home. He was to sail on a ship moored at Darling Harbour. I remember how disappointed we all were that he was leaving us at the end of his studies after the years he had spent here at school at TAS in Armidale and then at the University of Sydney. However, a surprise awaited us when we found him up on deck with a young lady—he had told us nothing about girlfriends—her name it turned out was Angeline, your mother. They were sailing home together.

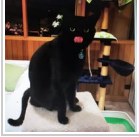

“ Mr Hong taught me in Montfort Sec 4A, Class of 75. He was an extraordinary History teacher. If you studied his notes, you're almost guaranteed of an A in the O Levels - which many of us achieved. He knew the subject well.

He also started a small class library. Many of us learned to appreciate reading because of that.

After our O Levels, he invited the whole class to his house in Serangoon Gardens. He cooked for us all, painstakingly preparing a delicious sweet and sour pork dish from scratch.

I didn't play football, but schoolmates who did spoke well of Mr Hong. He was as passionate on the pitch as he was in the classroom.

Many decades after school, I learnt that students from a Montfort Pre-U class would meet up with him whenever he was back in Singapore.

It was through a student in this class - who happened to be a work contact - that I managed to get in touch with Mr Hong after 50 years.

His son, Shannon, invited me to speak to Mr Hong on his phone. Mr Hong was already in hospital, and under palliative care. I managed to say a big Thank You to him, and I could hear he struggled a "thank you very much" in return. He died a couple of days later.

Mr Hong left behind a vast legacy. Thousands of students he taught over several decades will remember him.
