I will always treasure the memory of the 3 of us climbing Victoria Peak to admire the sunset. We also conquered 268 steps of the magnificent Tian Tan Buddha – one of life's beautiful coincidence as we happened to

be in HK at the same time.

Linda Habibi, you were truly one of a kind, you fought hard for your life, for your loved ones and you live fully, never holding back.

On Monday, 3rd March 2025, Linda has left this world after 7 months battle with cancer. In her final week, for the first time I heard she say words that broke my heart:

“I want to go. I have had enough in this life...”

My Linda - the warrior, the great fighter, the Linda I had always known – was finally ready to rest.

Surrounded by the love of her 2 sisters, Christina and dear friends, Linda has peacefully passed at 12.45pm on that day.
