When my father brought the family to Hong Kong in the late 1940's to escape the Communist takeover in China, Auntie Marina's mother took us in by renting us a room in their flat. Auntie Marina was a loving auntie. I still have vivid memory of her & me role playing two sisters traveling together and sharing dried shrimps she took from the kitchen. When she went to nursing school, she would often take me on her days off on rides on the tram or explore street foods on the Hong Kong island. When she took tailoring lessons, she made me a lined, knee-length wool coat that I proudly paraded around & announced who the able tailor was. Her virtues are many. Foremost is her caring nature. I was working in the U.S. when my mother passed away in Hong Kong. I am forever indebted to Auntie Marina for helping my father, braving the rainstorm with Uncle Wan to offer condolence to my father, helping him with funeral arrangements, even advancing the money for him. Rest in Peace, Auntie Marina, yours was a life well lived. You will always be in my heart.
