Allow me to elaborate on Helen's story about how mum healed a little boy who suffered from polio. It was nothing short of a miracle. Mum was a traditional Chinese medicine practitioner. I was about 7 when this well off couple brought their only child to see mum. The boy was around my age and was already on clutches. Apparently he had been seeing many western doctors who concluded his illness was incurable; to become wheelchair bound for the rest of his life.
Mum treated the boy for over half a year. One day mum asked the boy to drop his clutches and walk towards his parents. As the boy walked gingerly to his parents I still remember vividly they were elated with teary eyes.
To express their gratitude they took our whole family out in their ginormous limousine for a day trip but that is another story.
Mum also healed numerous others who succumbed to asthma, migraine, shingles etc.
I miss my mum dearly.

After taking me to enroll in kindergarten my mother got sick, as a result my father could not go out but had to stay back to help manage the laundry shop. When his friends and brothers from the same village found out, they all said why send a girl to a Private school, so dad wanted to stop her sending me there. However, my mother refused, saying girls should get the same education as boys. I knew about this because the same story gets repeated many times when I graduate from UNSW as an Electrical Engineer and when every time, I got a promotion and/or pay rise from work. She had taught me that women are not the weaker sex.

She was thrifty on herself but very generous to others. She had many friends all over the world. In 1979 I travelled with my parents for three months to Hawaii, LA, San Fransico, Japan, Taiwan, HK then back to Sydney. We only had to stay in hotel in Hawaii and Japan. In LA, so many of her friends wanted to give us a treat that sometimes we must have 5 meals a day with different people.

On my parents' 50th wedding Anniversary, I helped to arrange a trip around the world for the two of them. Everywhere they went, there would be friends to pick them up from the airport to stay at their homes and showed them around. They did not need to stay in a hotel or take a taxi.

I am lucky that when I was a “stay home” mum for 14 years from 2002, I got to spend most morning taking long walk with her. She told me lots of stories from her life. She was the only girl in her village that can read or write because my grandmother was a schoolteacher. My mother made a living writing letter for people. She used to charge 1 HKD per page, but she won't charge those who cannot afford it. She told me how my grandmother learnt Chinese medicine from a monk. My mother also picked up the skill and helped a lot of people in HK. She had even cured someone suffering from polio. Regrettably only my sister Luly pick up one of the skills, now all is lost.

She was a remarkable woman and believe in equal right for man and woman. I owned my education to her.

帶我去報讀幼兒園後，媽媽生病了，爸爸不能出門，只能留下來幫忙打理洗衣店。同村的朋友和兄弟們知道後，都說為什麼要送一個女孩去貴族學校，所以爸爸不想再送我去。然而，我媽媽拒絕了，說女孩應該和男孩一樣接受教育。我知道這個故事是因為當我以電氣工程師的身份從新南威爾士大學畢業或每次我得到晉升和或加薪，同樣的故事都會重復一片。她教會了我女人不是較弱的性別。

她對自己很吝嗇，但對別人卻很慷慨。她在世界各地都有朋友。

1979年，我和父母一起去夏威夷、洛杉磯、舊金山、日本、台灣、香港旅行了三個月。我們只須在夏威夷和日本住酒店，其他地方都有朋友招待。在洛杉磯，她的很多朋友都想請我們食餐，有時我們必須一天和不同的人一起吃5頓飯。

在我父母結婚50週年之際，我幫助他們兩人安排了一次環球旅行。他們走到哪裡，都會有朋友從機場接他們去自己的家佳，帶他們四處玩。他們不需要住在旅館裡。真是朋友滿天下。

我很幸運，從2002年開始，我做了14年的全職媽媽，大部分時間我都可以和她一起早上散步。她給我講了很多她年輕時的故事。她是村里唯一會讀書寫字的女子，因為我的祖母是一名教師。我的母親以寫信為生。過去她每頁紙收費一元港幣，但她不會向負擔不起的人收費。她告訴我祖母是如何從一個和尚那裡學中醫的。我媽媽也學會了一些中醫的技能，在香港幫助了很多人。她甚至治癒了患有小兒麻痺症的人。可惜只有我家姐露莉學到了一個技能，現在全都失丟了。她是一個了不起的女人，相信男人和女人的權利平等。我的教育歸功於她。
