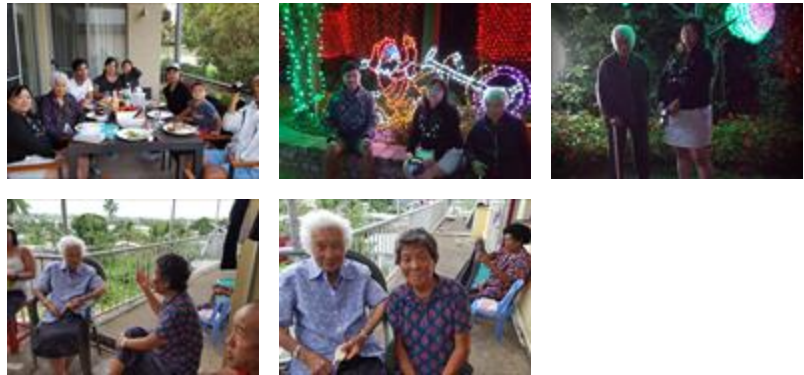

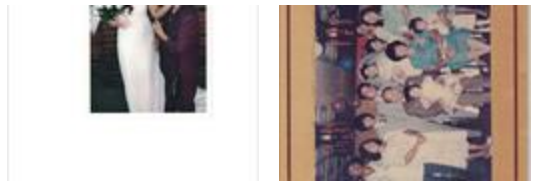

My mother liked to cook and share. We tried to fathom why she needed to make so much that my siblings and I were taking pots of extra food home. She had a saying: “ Guests should never go hungry” I find my sister Rachel and myself doing the same thing and hearing our own children asking us the same question. Must be in my DNA. My earliest memories of her need to include other relatives in her and Dad’s birthdays was packing a brown paper bag with a quarter piece of roast chicken, a piece of roast pork and some fried sesame dumpling to our relatives and close friends. It involved my sister getting into the car with me jumping out and delivering this almost oil stained brown paper bag to each home. I am sure it bought much happiness to Mum and thank goodness Suva was a small city.
