“ Dear Family and Friends,

I have included the text to my Dad's eulogy below:

Anthony: "我們一家三口二十三年前從香港移民澳洲，在香港我和芬是同一間中學教書，她教家政及英文而我教數學及電腦，她對學生非常友善，關心學生，深受學生愛戴，學生畢業後也經常與她聯絡，縱使移民這麼久，每次回香港學生都會約她聚會，我深信很多學生都很懷念她的親切及誠懇的教導。

她在香港任教過二間中學，呂明才中學及姚連生中學，她為人認真，處事嚴謹，一個很負責任的老師，工作上與同事非常合作，課餘時她是很活躍，在呂明才她是住學校宿舍，與一班年青同事有很多活動，她經常懷念這多年的歡樂時光，移民後這班同事也成為我們的好友，她對朋友很真心、寬容、誠懇及關懷。她燦爛的笑容是永遠不會忘記。

移民後她放棄教學工作，做了些散工就轉入美國運通信用卡(Amex)，一做就二十年直至兩年前退休，在Amex認識一班不同文化及種族的同事，她仍然處事認真，勤奮，有空時還會幫助同事，贏得這班同事對她的敬重及愛護，在她患病期間無數的Amex同事對她多次鼓勵，關懷及探訪。我很欣賞她有一個良善的心，對所有人都能體諒、關懷及幫助。

更加令我欣賞她的地方是她對家庭的照顧、愛護。她經常散發出溫馨的愛給她的家人，患病了十年都她對母親隱瞞癌症的病情，她不忍心看見年邁母親傷心及難過。死前三日還裝著無病與媽媽講電話，她的死訊仍然未通知媽媽。她亦都很愛錫兄弟姊妹，每當他們有病或有問題時，她會即時慰問或幫助。例如她的姨甥Gordan及姪女Hilda過來澳洲讀書，她義不容辭便答允照顧他們在我家住宿，待他們是自己的子女。她付出的是不期望任何回報只因為她對所有人一種愛，一種無條件的愛。

2013年她癌病復發，2014年2月接受手術，手術後身體有些缺陷，她的左腳腳掌已不受控制，當時她不能夠走路，令她非常沮喪，記得她一次在醫院躺在病牀嚎哭，哭著說她一定會學行得返，離開醫院時她

也不能走路，轉入康復院是星期五下午，她未有機會當天見固定物理治療師，星期六及日都有日常的物理治療課，當值的物理治療師是臨時的，課堂中安排她要做的動作她都應付不來，她的自信給這二天課堂完全破壞了，星期一我私底下與固定物理治療師討論她的情況及信心問題，她很識安慰及鼓勵她，她從這天重拾信心，由大型輔助學行器轉為四輪車仔，她不斷堅持及努力，經過二三個月時間再轉車仔為二枝拐杖，離開康復院時只需一枝拐杖，過程對她絕不容易，運動不是她的強項、好多動作我都要解釋及示範給她，還記得我們要一起共舞學習重心由一隻腳轉移到另一隻腳，她發揮了無比的毅力及決心，最終她也達成指定目標。出院前她還很感恩地送了一個名牌手袋給這位物理治療師。

澳洲生活給我們認識了七個家庭，八家的孩子年紀相若，大部份讀同一間小學，很自然我們發展到很親密的朋友，每星期都有活動，包括晚飯、行山、打羽毛球等。生活非常開心、充實。自從她患病後，他們都幫忙我們一家很多，連今次的喪禮，他們也出了不小力，當然幫助我家的人，不止這七家，有教會的朋友、Amex同事，再一次好好多謝這些親友。

最後要提是她對我和Ambrose的愛，一個偉大的母親，從不間斷為Ambrose着想，為他安排一切，無微不至，記得她掛心Ambrose和同學去歐洲旅行遺失證件及信用咭，旅行前已影了所有證件及信用咭，她當然做了明智決定。她為我及Ambrose做的事實在太多，在醫院時我們、芸叔及師母和她討論她的心願，她的心願都是為了Ambrose和我着想、很感激她在苦難中仍記掛我們。多年來她雖然很感謝我對她的照顧但她亦經常感到非常內疚，覺得自己是一個負累，時常向我說對不起，深愛她的我內心非常痛苦，不忍心見她受盡苦痛及折磨，只想做一切令她舒服一些。現在她已得到解脫，但我仍然不捨得她的離開。

“ Dear Family And Friends,

I have included the text to part 2 of my eulogy below:

Ambrose: "As much as my Mum loved the world, she loved the people that God had placed in her life even more.

28 years ago God placed me in her and Dad's life.

As a Mum, she was the most attentive and caring mum a boy could ask for. I am not ashamed to admit that I was a huge mama's boy and that she'd wrap me up in cotton wool for the rest of my life if she could. I remember when I had just started Uni, I was getting a taste of big boy independence with my new car, a car full of friends and Kanye West bumping in the stereo system - I was a cool guy. I get a call, which is going through to my car bluetooth - Of course i want to answer and show my friends this amazing new technology (it was 10 years ago). I answer the call: "Wai baby, are you coming home for dinner?". Laughter erupted and any street cred was gone. But I am my mother's son, in that case my mother's baby.

I couldn't see it then but can see it now, all those moments and gestures when mum was asking whether I was coming home for dinner, or telling me to bring a jacket, they were all her small paint strokes, in the big picture which was a mother's love.

When she first got sick in 2007, my world was rocked, I was a carefree 19 year old just starting Uni, now having to deal with something very real and scary. But instead of feeling sorry for herself, or like the world was caving in, my mum gave me a hug and told me that she'd fight this for me and Dad. And boy, did she fight.

In her 9 year fight, she always lived on her terms. Even in times when she was undergoing treatment she would make sure to join her friends on their hikes and outings when her body allowed. In periods of remission she went off to see the Grand Canyon and the

Glaciers in Alaska with her beloved friends and doting Husband.

Even as her body was failing, the day before she was last admitted to hospital, she made my Dad take her to get her hair dyed.

I am definitely my mother's son.

Finally I just want to tell her how much I love her and miss her everyday.

But to tell her not to worry because I can still feel her with us. During this difficult time, wherever I have seen her friends and family supporting and caring for each other and making each other smile or laugh, I am reminded of her and feel that she is still here.

So I urge us all, her friends and family, to continue to be her living memory. Care for each other, put others first and do it with faith and a smile on your face, like she would have. If we do that she continues to live with us.

And I hope that i can continue to live my life to honour her, showing others the care and selflessness which she had and faith and resillience in difficult times, so that the people that knew her can proudly say "he is his mother's son.""

Ambrose: "Firstly, on behalf of our Family i would like to thank those in attendance today and those who have offered their love and support during this difficult time.

I would especially like to thank my Dad. Dad you have been Mum's rock and the rock of our family. Mum's battle was long but well fought, because you have been there throughout, her sword and shield. Even though Mum's time with us was nowhere near as long as anybody would have liked, you made sure that every single precious second she had was filled with love, joy and care. We are both very lucky to have you.

My Mum was born in Hong Kong to my grandparents Chan Kay and Li Big Chun. Sister to five siblings their family laid their roots in Hong Kongs' Rainbow Estate. The estate was home to many humble hardworking families like my mum's who may not have been the most well off but hers was tight knit and supported each other.

My Mum in her life played many roles, loving wife and mother, adored daughter, treasured friend. But put simply she was a lover and a fighter.

She loved to see the world because God had made it beautiful. I had always known that she had travelled a lot in her youth, but going through our old family albums in preparation for today, I was counting all the places she had been, places like China, Thailand, The Phillipines to Italy, France, Switzerland and Greece.

I was a bit jealous at first. How has Mum been to all those places that I haven't??? But that feeling was quickly overtaken by one of comfort. I realised what a full life my Mum had lead and how she got to see the world which she found so beautiful. From her family's

humble beginnings, she worked to become a Teacher and then saved enough so that she could travel, in an era where travelling was less commonplace, because seeing the world was important to her.

My mother loved art too and the beautiful things that people could create. I remember her showing me books at home of Monet's Water Lillies and Turner's water colours, when i was much too young to comprehend why this was art, but I could tell that they looked nice. I think in these moments she shaped how I was to see the world and I am grateful that she taught me to appreciate the beauty around me and in the things that people create.

Because of these traits we often joked at home that I had completely taken after my Mum's traits and none of my Dad's good ones. We joked that we weren't even really sure whether my dad was my dad. So when I would come home with another bag of shopping, added to the sneaker collection or spent a bit too much time in the bathroom doing my hair: "You are your mother's son" he would say."

You executed your job superbly. You had been a very demanding, yet understanding teacher, much liked by students and colleagues. In addition you had also taken up a variety of extra-curricular activities which included establishing and leading our girl guide brigade (The New Territories Brigade 176), organizing the Home Economics Club and Sewing Club (you are really good at making stuffed toys!) Because of your capability, devotion and full-hearted dedication you were promoted to a more senior position 5 years later.

Somehow, unintentionally though, our school has been a cradle to many romantic adventures between staff, leading to a good number of 'they live happily ever after' marriages. You and Anthony are one of them. As the school started the computer program after moving to our own campus, I invited Anthony to join us to head that department which he accepted. What happened in between I am unable to furnish with detail, but the outcome is a successful marriage that everyone has witnessed.

Last October when I was informed that you, Anthony and a few former colleagues planned to visit us in Toronto prior to enjoying the breath-taking fall colours in other parts of Ontario and Quebec I was overjoyed and looked excitedly forward to the reunion. Unfortunately

you could not show up and now we know why.

Teresa, I have to thank you for what you have done to make the Home Economics department, the Girl Guides and other extra-activities a success when the school was at its embryonic stage. I miss you as a person who is always so full of energy, friendly, compassionate, kind-hearted and never fail to put on a happy, smiling face.
